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1. Background

The year 2021 is very special for Bangladesh as we are celebrating the Golden Jubilee Celebration of our Independence and the Birth Centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, 'Mujib Borsho'.

The undisputed leader and the greatest Bangali of all time, the Father of the Nation taught the nation to stand firm in the world by ending exploitation, deprivation and oppression. Bangabandhu struggled for 24 long years to unfetter the Bengali nation from the shackles of subjugation, and led on all fronts from the language movement to the war of freedom.

The Father of the Nation dreamt of building a non-communal, hunger-free and prosperous Bangladesh, resisting all imminent conspiracies and adversities. Inspired by the spirit of the Great Liberation War, he had turned Bangladesh into a least developed country pulling the war-ravaged nation in just three and a half years' time.

Now, his elder daughter and worthy successor, Honorable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and her spirited government is leading the country to achieve some of the coveted goals as the Honorable Prime Minister has set goals to achieve graduation from LDC to developing country by 2024, the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030, to transform Bangladesh into an upper-middle income country, to become a high-income and developed country by 2041 and a prosperous Delta by 2100.

The Department of Inspection for Factories and Establishments (DIFE) under the Ministry of Labour and Employment is responsible for ensuring welfare, safety and health of valuable human resources working in various sectors contributing national development. 2. Scope of Work

a. Deliverables/Outputs:

The documentary is to be empathy driven, moving and motivational, told mainly from the perspective of the mentioned section (EOI), with interviews and inputs from local & VIP communities, decision makers and the DIFE as per script demands. Firm should include below segment in the documentary:

1. 1920-1947

- The socio economic condition of British Bengal.
- Bangabandhu Childhood (Tungipara, Primary school, High school, Islamia College (Kolkata),Bekar Hostel (Kolkata), Dhaka University i.e support to a movement of the Class 4 employees)
- Bangabandhu's involvement in social welfare and beginning of politics
- Effort to help in the communal riot.



2. Language Movement and Bangabandhu

- Bangabandhu rising in politics
- Foundation of student league and Awami League
- Leadership in language movement

3. United Front Election

- Election campaign
- Bangabandhu was the Minister of Industries, commerce, labour, anti-corruption and village aid in 1956.
- Leaving the cabinet to work full-time for the party organization in 1956.

4. Six point movement, Eleven point programme and mass movement

- Eleven point programme
- Six point declaration and movement
- Agartala conspiracy case (*State vs. Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and others*)

5. Bangabandhu title and declaring the name of a new nation

6. Election of 1970

7. Liberation war of 1971

- 7th march speech
- Declaration of independence
- Tongi resist by labour
- Mujib nagar government formation in 17th April
- Excellence in leadership of the father of the nation
- How sonar Bangla was imagined in that time of liberation war

8. Head of the government(1972-1975)

- Return to Bangladesh on 10th January and planning to reform whole country
- International recognition of Bangladesh as a sovereign and strong nation
- Introduce of national constitution
- Economic and labour reforms (May day declaration in Bangladesh in 1972)
- Effort to create employment
- Speech for the labour and farmer class of Bangladesh
- Public meeting addressing to labour issue
- Ratification of 29 ILO conventions(Including 6 core conventions) in 1972
- Industries (owned by non-bangali) nationalization
- His plan, vision, actions for the labours and farmers community and who lived under the poverty line.
- Focusing on labour well-being, his work, empathy, and dedication for the worker community
- His dreams, vision and creativity for the lower income groups, workers and labours during his government after the independence.



8. 1975, death of dreams

The documentary should be produced in Bangla with English subtitle, at highest market quality standards, high-definition, fast paced and colorful, with clean stylistic touches. The total running time of the documentary is to be 30 minutes. The entire film production i.e. writing, filming, editing, voicing/narration etc should be done by the firm, delivering a final ready-to-air product in broadcast standards and in HD technology format.

b. Materials/Production:

- The firm will do the concept development for documentary.
- The consulting firm will provide the script to DIFE Concern Department for review and approve.
- The firm will start working after getting approve final script from DIFE.
- All the production materials will provide by consulting firm.
- Documentation duration is expected approximately 30 minutes.

c. Technical Requirements:

- Broadcast quality full HD video, 1920 x1080p.
- Professional sound recording.
- National level Artist voice over.
- HD web files and HD DVD as final products.

d. Expected Timeline:

- The firm shall start the work as soon as possible, immediately upon signing contract.
- A detailed timeline, work plan and draft outline should be submitted within 14 days.
- A detailed budget and shooting schedule should be provided prior to commencing filming.
- The rough cut of every phase of the documentary should be provided to Executive Producer, i.e. DIFE concern authority for review, comments and approval.

3. Time Frame (Documentary):

Complete documentary submission deadline: within 15 (fifteen) days after the contract signing.

4. Eligibility:

- Three links to work samples demonstrating most relevant previous productions.
- Three references (with contact information) from previous clients.
- Detailed list with technical information of the equipment intended for use, including camera, light, sound, editing software etc.
- Brief presentation of the team, with CVs and functional responsibilities of the key people to be engaged in the production of the documentary.
- Experience of working under Govt./Semi-Govt/Autonomous body (work order with work completion certificate must be submitted, during last 3 years.
- Trade License renewed for current financial year (2020-2021).



- Company Certificate of Incorporation in case of company,.
- National ID Card of the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) /Managing Director (MD),
- VAT Certificate
- Taxpayer Identification Number TIN
- Income tax Certificate for the assessment year 2020-2021.
- Bank credit/working capital/Bank liquid certificate of at least BDT 20 Lac
- proof of overall working experience minimum three years in any Govt./semi-Govt/Autonomous body,
- List of working personal & experts shall have to be submitted
- A list of documents submitted is also warranted.

5. Qualification Criteria

- Minimum of three (3) years' documented work experience in the area of film/reportage/documentary writing, producing, directing and editing. Previous Govt. documentary making experience will add advantage.
- Access to highest quality filming, light, sound and editing equipment
- Ability to operate under strict time limits and apply high production and technical standards for the purpose of maintaining high level of professionalism
- Ability to communicate and conduct interviews in English and Bangla
- Track record of successful materials filmed in the region and/or on similar topics would be an asset.

6. Submission

The firm will report to Department of Inspection for factories and establishment and work closely with Program Coordinator for successfully completed the said documentary.
